As of 30 June 2025, the Bank reported an LCR of 290%, with a quarterly average of 276%, reflecting a disciplined approach to liquidity management. High-Quality Liquid Assets—primarily sovereign and central bank securities—totaled MUR 7.84 billion at period-end, with a quarterly average of MUR 7.09 billion. Strategic oversight, stress testing, and funding diversification continue to reinforce compliance and financial resilience.
